At our last Deacons meeting, Doris Griffin shared a poem by Amy Carmichael called *Calvary Love*. I offer a portion of that poem for you to read....It is very appropriate these days after Easter. Amy Carmichael was a <u>Protestant</u> Christian missionary in India, who opened an orphanage and founded a mission in Dohnavur. She served in India for 55 years without furlough and wrote many books about her missionary work.

If I belittle those whom I am called to serve, talk of their weak points in contrast perhaps with what I think of as my strong points; if I adopt a superior attitude, forgetting "Who made thee to differ? And what hast thou that thou hast not received?" then I know nothing of Calvary love.

If I can enjoy a joke at the expense of another; if I can in any way slight another in conversation, or even in thought, then I know nothing of Calvary love.

If I can write an unkind letter, speak an unkind word, think an unkind thought without grief and shame, then I know nothing of Calvary love.

If I do not feel far more for the grieved Savior than for my worried self when troublesome things occur, then I know nothing of Calvary love.

If I am afraid to speak the truth, lest I lose affection, or lest the one concerned should say, "You do not understand," or because I fear to lose my reputation for kindness; if I put my own good name before the other's highest good, then I know nothing of Calvary love.

If I am soft to myself and slide comfortably into self-pity and self-sympathy; If I do not by the grace of God practice fortitude, then I know nothing of Calvary love.

If I take offense easily, if I am content to continue in a cool unfriendliness, though friendship be possible, then I know nothing of Calvary love.

If I feel bitter toward those who condemn me, as it seems to me, unjustly, forgetting that if they knew me as I know myself they would condemn me much more, then I know nothing of Calvary love.

If souls can suffer alongside, and I hardly know it, because the spirit of discernment is not in me, then I know nothing of Calvary love.

If I refuse to allow one who is dear to me to suffer for the sake of Christ, if I do not see such suffering as the greatest honor that can be offered to any follower of the Crucified, then I know nothing of Calvary love.

If I slip into the place that can be filled by Christ alone, making myself the first necessity to a soul instead of leading it to fasten upon Him, then I know nothing of Calvary love.

If my interest in the work of others is cool; if I think in terms of my own special work; if the burdens of others are not my burdens too, and their joys mine, then I know nothing of Calvary love.

If the ultimate, the hardest, cannot be asked of me; if my fellows hesitate to ask it and turn to someone else, then I know nothing of Calvary love.

If I covet any place on earth but the dust at the foot of the Cross, then I know nothing of Calvary love.

That which I know not, teach Thou me, O Lord, my God.

"No one can feel angry, happy or sad on command. For this reason, feelings are not right or wrong." As I read this statement in the Stephen Ministry Training Manual (SMTM), I realized how enormous this simple statement was.

I have felt shame and guilt because of something I have no control over. I have tried to hide my feeling at times. I have learned through the Stephen Ministry that there is healing in sharing our feelings in a confidential, non-judgmental Christ-centered environment. The Stephen Ministry trains us to work through those uncomfortable, sometimes shameful feelings instead of packing them away. Christ wants us to share and not to endure trouble alone. Our honest feelings are an offering we can bring to God, and even ugly feelings can point the way toward God. I have learned that God is big enough to shoulder our anger and pain.


Are you ready to be a MCYOUTH???

Presbyterian Women Birthday Offering Collected May 14

The Presbyterian Women Birthday Offering will be collected on Mother's Day, May 14. Gifts contributed this year will help fund three important projects.

The First Hand Aid Rural Clinic Development Initiative will establish six medical clinics within local Presbyterian churches near communities in Cuba that have difficult access to health care.

Family Justice Center of Georgetown and Horry Counties' Safe Haven for Victims of Domestic Violence, in South Carolina, will build a new shelter and increase the number of lives they touch from 11 to 35. They will even help family pets.

The Navajo Water Project will provide water systems to families on a Navajo reservation in New Mexico who do not have direct access to running water.
